Logan Creighton brings to life the story of four United States Army chaplains who gave their lives to save other civilian and military personnel as the troop ship SS Dorchester sank on February 3, 1943, during World War II. They helped other soldiers board lifeboats and gave up their own life jackets when the supply ran out.

The chaplains joined arms, said prayers, and sang hymns as they went down with the ship. Performed by local resident Logan Creighton, well-known historical presenter and seasoned performer of many significant roles.

President's Message "At the Peak"

The Friends of the Idyllwild Library are very fortunate and happy to sponsor a large variety of programs at our library this year. Programs so far this year have included "The Palms to Pines Birding and Nature Trail," "Life Zones, Deserts to Mountains," "Hiking the Pacific Crest Trail," the historical beginning of the famous hymn, "Amazing Grace," "Journey of an Idyllwild Kid to the PGA Tour", and others. Coming up at our annual meeting on October 1st at 2 p.m. at the Rainbow Inn, we are excited to present our esteemed friend, Duffy Hudson, returning in "The Life and Magic of Harry Houdini."



Duffy Hudson is an actor, director, writer, teacher and filmmaker. After graduating from college, he moved to New York City where he attended the Circle in the Square Theater School, on Broadway. He studied with several great directors including Michael Kahn, Nikos Psacharopoulos, Nakita Mikhalkov, Sandra Seacat, and Larry Moss.

He has performed in hundreds of plays, both on and off Broadway, and has directed more than three-

hundred theatrical pieces, including workshop productions with Brooke Shields, The Three Sisters with Jessica Lange, Don Johnson and Tatum O'Neal, and Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf with Marlo Thomas. Duffy founded several theatre companies, including "I Comici Confidenti," in New York City. He has performed in numerous commercials and has several feature film credits to his name as well. He has taught drama at the professional and collegiate levels, combining experience with talent. His "one man shows" include "Edgar Allan Poe," "Albert Einstein," "George Burns," "Doctor Seuss," and Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol", all of which have been presented here in Idyllwild. In October, he will present the life story of "Harry Houdini" at our Annual Meeting.

American illusionist and stunt performer, Harry Houdini, was born in Budapest, Hungary on March 24, 1874, with the name Ehrich Weisz. He had five siblings and was the son of a rabbi. Weisz came to the United States in 1878 and moved to Appleton, Wisconsin, where his father took a job at the Zion Reform Congregation. The family name was changed to Weiss. After Rabbi Weiss lost his tenure at Zion, the family moved to New York City. As a child, Ehrich made his public debut as a nine-year old trapeze artist, calling himself, "Ehrich, the Prince of the Air." He was also a cross-country runner and a professional magician. At this time, he started calling himself "Harry Houdini," after the Frenchman Jean Eugène Robert-Houdin.

Houdini began his magic career in 1891 while performing in local sideshows and 'dime museums.' Soon after that he began experimenting with escape acts. Within months, he was performing at the top vaudeville houses in the country. In 1900, Houdini toured Scotland, England, Germany, France, the Netherlands, and Russia, where he challenged local police to restrain him with shackles and lock him in their jails, from which he readily escaped. Throughout his extensive career in magic and disappearing, Houdini never claimed to have any supernatural powers. For most of his career, Houdini was a headline act in vaudeville, and for many years, he was the highest-paid performer in American vaudeville.

I truly hope that all of you can attend this afternoon performance where **Duffy Hudson** will transform himself into Harry Houdini. You will not regret it!

Gift Certificates for Newborns

We want to remind you about the ongoing \$5 Gift Certificate program, which is available to parents of Idyllwild area newborns. The certificate is redeemable at the Friends of the Library Bookstore and can be used to purchase any book or media in the bookstore. Our hope is that this program will encourage parents to read to their children at an early age. Also, children who see their parents reading are more apt to become readers themselves. This program is another wonderful way the Friends of the Library encourage parents to read to their children. So, if you know of any newborns (up to one-year of age), please be sure to inform the parents about this program.

Treasurer's Report

Account Balances, Income & Expenditures YTD as of July 31, 2016:

The total balances in the checking and money market accounts are up by \$58.75, bringing the total to \$72,169.97. Income exceeded Expenditures by \$58.75 in July. Membership income is up \$20 from where it was in July of last year. Bookstore sales are up \$85.88 from where they were in July of last year. The Friends of the Library made \$48 from the Art Mingle book sales held at Higher Grounds Coffee Shop in cooperation with the Art Alliance of Idyllwild. Unrestricted income was \$1,133.60, which is \$140.98 more than this month last year. Unrestricted expenditures were \$1,074.85, which is \$594.97 more than this month last year. Year to date, expenditures exceeded Income by \$6,738.74

Additionally, The Friends of the Library made

a payment for the NewsBank service in the amount of \$6,974.52. This is a service that will digitize past issues of the Town Crier to make them available to the public through the library.

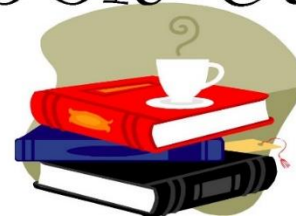

Touching History II

In the Spring 2016 issue of Speaking Volumes, I had the opportunity to introduce the partnership between the Idyllwild Library, the Idyllwild Area Historical Society and the Idyllwild Town Crier that would bring issues of the Historical Town Crier online at the Library. The project is progressing. We just received the return of our first shipment back from NewsBank and they have put up most of the 1960s for us to peruse. Bob Smith from the IAHS and I have already answered several unanswerable questions we have been holding on to until those dates were available. Personally, I've found it very difficult not to sit and read the paper when I should be doing other things. This purchase has opened a window to the past that is very difficult not to fall through.

You are invited to come to the Library and use the public computers to travel into Idyllwild's past by simply clicking a link on the desktop. The years 1947 through 1966 are available now with more to come shortly. We are sending the next ten years, the 1970s, to NewsBank to begin digitization this month. You can expect to see those years by the end of this year.

To make matters more difficult for those who lack the discipline not to sit in front of the computer reading the paper, we now have access for anyone who holds a Riverside County Library card. Patrons can sign in to the Historical Town Crier database from home, on the road with their laptops or tablets or even from your smartphone. Click on this unique URL for remote access:

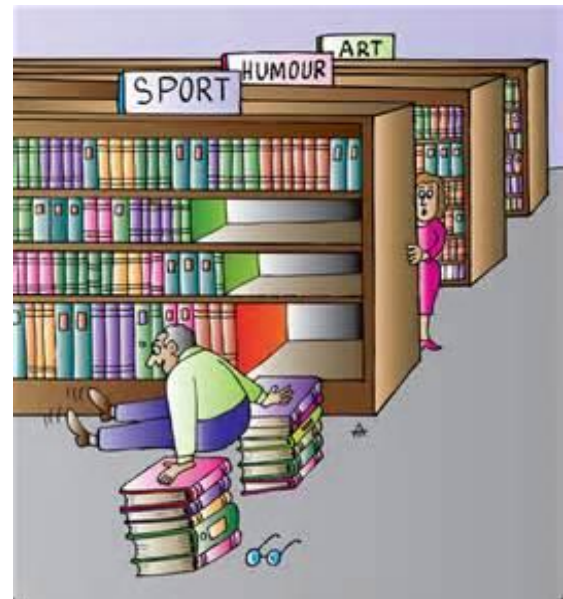
