School Libraries

Public and private school libraries are extremely valuable places where students, instructors, and staff have access to many types of books and a variety of other resources. The goal of school libraries is to serve as "learner-oriented laboratories which support, extend, and individualize the school's curriculum". (Morris, B. 2004. "Administering the School Library Media Center", Westport, CT, Libraries Unlimited – p. 32)

School libraries are extremely beneficial to students and have had a positive impact on educational achievement. Statistics show that students who utilize school libraries score higher on reading assessments regardless of their socio-economic status. Most students believe that the libraries have contributed to success in their educational pursuits. According to Kathleen D. Smith in "Building Student Learning through School Libraries", school library media centers in the 21st century can, and should be "hubs for increased student achievement and positive focused school reform." *Knowledge Quest*, v31 n1 suppl p45-49 Sep-Oct 2002.

School libraries offer a wide range of learning opportunities to many people. They are places for study, independent research, homework, and computer work. The school library is also a center for much information that is currently available. In the early 1960's, I would begin my day in the school library preparing for classes, reviewing for tests, and greeting friends. It was good preparation for a day of intensive study and work. Please support our school libraries - they will enrich you and enhance your learning experience.

Children's Program – Story Time

We did it! We completed another year of story times and special events, and we are looking forward to the new year with many more wonderful story times and events for the children who visit the Idyllwild Library.

Some highlights of the final months of 2016:

- September - **Roald Dahl's 100th Birthday** celebration was a big hit. The children received golden tickets upon entering the party. They made Mr. Twit's beards and BFG (Big Friendly Giant) party hats, received party bags containing Roald Dahl activity sheets, viewed "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory," and party-goers loved eating a slice of birthday cake.
- **Idyllwild Fire Department** helped us observe **National Fire Prevention Month** in October. **Chief Rietz** read several stories. The children dressed up in fire gear and toured a fire truck, an ambulance, and another emergency vehicle. They all got to take home fire hats.
- **Hispanic Heritage Month and Dia de los Muertos** was commemorated for several weeks at the library with **Hispanic-themed craft stations**, craft classes, and book displays. Patrons were able to come into the library at any time and make various crafts, such as piñatas, paper flowers, maracas, God's eyes, and several different skull masks. In addition, artist **Terryann Halloran** taught four **Dia de los Muertos craft classes**, which featured an air dry clay class, a memory box class, a jeweled-skeleton charm class, and a skull mask class. All of these cultural classes and Hispanic crafts workshops were well attended by patrons and visitors.



- **Trick-or-Treat at the Library** – As children stopped by the library, each one received a water bottle decorated with a bat, a Halloween comic book, popcorn, a selected book, and a treat bag containing pencil, stickers, bookmark, candy, and glow stick bracelet.

- November – **Loma Linda University's School of Public Health** presented an informative and entertaining asthma awareness puppet show and conducted free toddler asthma screenings.
- **Ann Bowers, Wildlife Biologist, U.S. Forest Service**, taught us all about squirrels.
- November 28 – **Sandii Castleberry** brings to the library her musical enrichment program "**Holiday Hoedown**" to kick off the holiday season. Of course, this program is for everyone's enjoyment.
- December 12 – Actor and local resident **Connor O'Farrell** will read some classic holiday stories along with **Rachel Torrey**.
- December 17 – **Santa's Workshop** will return this year. Children can make holiday cards and gifts to share with family and friends
- December 19 – **Mrs. Claus** is coming to the library. The children will be treated to a story, a magic show and face painting. Also, they'll enjoy making a craft and receive a wrapped book.
- During the month of **December**, find the **hidden holiday squirrel** and receive a candy cane.
- We are pleased to offer **Beginning Conversational Italian** during November and December taught by Lucia Bartoli and Luciana LoPresto for adults, children (10- to 12-years accompanied by an adult), and teens.

We are looking forward to these events in the New Year:

- January and February story times will include: Snow plow story time with a real snow plow, Chinese New Year, Ground Hog Day, a puppet show, Valentine's Day.
- **January 7 and 14 – Family Film Festival** (Saturday events)
- **February 4 – "Take Your Child to Library Day"** (Saturday event) featuring **Sandii Castleberry's Musical Spoon Workshop** (made possible by a grant from the Art Alliance of Idyllwild) and young adult author **Diane Diehl**.
- **February 21-25 – STEAM Week Camp** – activities (science, technology, engineering, arts, math)

1,000 Books Before Kindergarten Update – Eighty-two preschoolers have signed up for *1,000 Books Before Kindergarten*. Two preschoolers have already reached the goal of reading 1,000 books; several others are just about to accomplish their goals. Any child from birth until beginning kindergarten can participate. The simple and enjoyable act of sharing books helps your child learn pre-reading skills such as understanding the sounds letters make, developing a bigger vocabulary, and building background knowledge – all important skills that help prepare your child for learning to read. Treasurer's Report

Account Balances, Income & Expenditures YTD as of Oct 31, 2016

- The total balances in the checking and money market accounts are down by \$271.80 from September, bringing the total to \$67,994.02.
- Expenditures exceeded income by \$271.80 for October
- Membership income is down \$80 from where it was in October of last year
- Bookstore sales are down \$260.16 from where they were in October of last year
- Unrestricted income was \$530.72 which is \$189.19 less than this month last year.
- Unrestricted expenditures were \$802.52 which is \$322.39 less than this month last year.
- Year to date, expenditures exceeded income by \$10,914.69
