

Biblioboard features content on a variety of topics, featuring local, independent authors from California and Riverside County specifically. Authors can use our Pressbooks platform to create and upload eBooks, and upon review, may be featured in this collection.

### **Cloud Library**

Download popular eBooks and eAudiobooks for free to your phone or tablet.

### Gale In Context: Environmental Studies

## **Children's Programs**

Fresh air, warmer weather and blooming flowers. What's not to love about spring? After our long, long winter we look forward to a beautiful spring season at the library.

Spring presents many great opportunities to share seasonal weekly story times and events with our children at the library. Here are some of the events that have been happening with the children's programs this spring:

First and foremost, I am pleased to announce the



new reading program **Tales to Tails** has finally become a reality. Rakeara, an AKC Therapy Dog, CGC, along with her handler Claire Spence come to us through a collaboration with the Animal Samaritans of Thousand Palms, California. They generously give their time in order help children boost their reading skills. Research data has shown that reading to dog programs actually help children improve their reading skills as



well as help children develop emotional and social skills. This program occurs the first Wednesday of every month following story time.



Another new and exciting program is the youth book club known as *The Best Idyllwild Book Club* led by Tate Donovan and moderated by Susan Righetti. The March book selection was **Space Case, No. 1** by Stuart Gibbs, and was attended by



eight club members ranging in age from nine to thirteen. After a review of the book, the children made collages depicting what items they would like to take with them to space. Some children drew an architectural plan of a space station. We enjoyed some special freeze-dried treats that astronauts eat in space, i.e. freeze-dried ice cream and dried fruit. Our April book choice is **Echo Mountain** by Lauren Wolk. We'll be reading **A Wolf Called Wonder** by Rosanne Parry in May.

We were pleased to be a part of the *Cover to Cover* Reading program again this year during March and April. For every five books a child reads (or is read to them), they receive a gift card for a free In-n-Out hamburger or cheeseburger. This is a great incentive to get children reading. We appreciate the generosity of In-n-Out for their sponsorship of this popular program. **STEAM** (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) programs have been a lot of fun. *Playing with Polymers* was our February theme, during which children learned about polymers. In March, we experimented with fizzy rainbow eggs. Children loved seeing the chemical reaction of an acid (vinegar) and a base (baking soda) when mixed together making a gas (carbon dioxide). In April, children discovered one of the ways meteorologists predict weather by making an anemometer.



This spring we are pleased to be able to present some outdoor story times at Riverside County's -Idyllwild Nature Center during their special events for *Earth Day* and for *Wildflowers of the San Jacinto Mountains*. We appreciate our cooperative agreement with Riverside County Regional Park and Open-Space District (Idyllwild Nature Center) and the Friends of the San Jacinto Mountains County Parks in order to bring these special outreach programs to our community.

Plans are well underway for our summer reading program. This year's theme is *Find Your Voice*. Dates for the summer reading program are June 12 to July 21, 2023. Watch for more information about the upcoming summer story times and events.

Please feel free to join us for any of the children's programs. Story times are every Wednesday morning at 10:30 a.m. Of course, we want to give a big thank you to the Friends of the Library for making so many programs possible.



mobilized Friends of the Library in creative ways, including a year-long celebration of the Library's




