3D Printing and Idyllwild Library

Hello everyone,

The Idyllwild Library now has a new 3D printer, soon to be available to the public. The money for the printer was donated to us for this purpose by The Rotary Club of Idyllwild.

What is 3d printing? 3D printing is an exciting technology that allows you to create three-dimensional objects from digital designs. It's often referred to as additive manufacturing because it builds objects layer by layer, unlike traditional subtractive methods like carving or cutting.

Here's an explanation of 3D printing for beginners:

The Basic Process: The 3D printing process typically involves these steps: a. **Designing**: You start by creating a 3D model of the object you want to print using computer-aided design (CAD) software. This digital design is saved as a 3D file, usually in STL format. b. **Slicing**: The 3D printer needs specific instructions on how to build the object layer by layer. Slicing software

takes the 3D model and divides it into thin horizontal layers, generating a set of instructions (G-code) for the printer. c. **Printing**: The 3D printer reads the G-code and starts building the object layer by layer. It uses various materials (e.g., plastic, resin, metal) depending on the type of 3D printer and the desired end product. d. **Cooling and Solidifying**: As each layer is laid down, the material is cooled or solidified, ensuring it adheres to the previous layer. This process continues until the entire object is complete.

Here's what the printer looks like...



We will have a beginner's class in October for anyone interested in learning about 3d printing and learning how to download files that are free from the web and then preparing these files for our specific printer. Below are pictures of some of the items that I have printed.











We look forward to working with everyone who wants to tryout the 3d printer. We are also looking for volunteers to help facilitate the use of the printer, if you have any experience with 3d printing and are willing to help others please call me at 951-306-4494. We hope to have everything in place by October and open the 3d printer to the public.

Children's Programs

We had a full summer with many great story times and activities. Riverside County Library System's summer reading 2023 theme *Find Your Voice* was explored with a different subtheme each week. We had a great time developing the weekly themes centered on various aspects of personal growth.

Looking back over the past weeks, the Idyllwild Library kicked off the summer reading program on June 14, 2023, with **Sandii Castleberry's** musical program **Singing Your Way to Reading.**



Jennifer Rago, face painter and Kutsch the Fire Dog were there to welcome the children to summer reading as well. For the second week's theme, *My Roots, My Story*, we were pleased to have author Sally Shum McDevitt read her multicultural book *Family Style* about eating traditional Chinese Dim Sum. Sally even taught the children some Cantonese words.

For the third week of summer reading *Express Yourself*, Rachel Torrey and The Spaceman Trilogy performed a delightful musical story time.



The fourth week theme of summer reading was about *Connecting with our Community.* We were so pleased to have **Sonny Waldron**, Park Ranger, Idyllwild Nature, come to teach us about the snakes that live in our area. Children got to hold **Jackson**, a king snake.



For Animal Talk Week, Janice Murasko, of Animal Rescue Friends, instructed the children how to safely interact with dogs. During Self-Care week, Riverside University Health System technicians presented a program about the importance of dental care using puppets to demonstrate proper toothbrushing techniques. Children received dental kits, books, and dental hygiene resource information.



In addition to story time, artist **Carlos Nieto**, **Anime Your Way**, taught a step-by-step anime drawing program.



On July 26, we closed summer reading with an awards party with **WACKO** the magician and Jennifer Rago, master balloon twister.

The top three readers in these age categories: 0-5 years, 6-12 years, and teens were each awarded bags full of great prizes. The top adult reader received a \$50 Barnes and Noble gift card and a bag of collectibles. In addition, we were able to award a backpack full of fun prizes each week through a random drawing of all entries who had registered for summer reading. We also had an impressive Branch Prize with some collectible items. The 5-Book Challenge recipients received a \$5-gift card to Atomic Cow Creamery. Everyone selected a free book when they registered and again when they completed reading five books as well as the awards party. We also awarded four tickets to Pretend City.

The summer reading program is now a memory, but what a great way to spend the summer diving into a lot of fantastic reading. We thank all of the children as well as the teens and the adults for participating in this year's sum=er reading program.

The Idyllwild Library participated in the Idyllwild Nature Center's Lemon Lily Festival on Saturday, July 15, 2023. Volunteer Carol Mendoza and I prepared a story walk which featured the book *The Lemon Lily Fairy* written by local author Sherri Domenigoni. The book's pages were laminated and mounted onto seventeen story boards, which were then numbered and placed in key locations along one of the Nature Center trails that led to Lily Creek, where the Lemon Lilies were in bloom.



As families hiked along the trail they were able to read the book. A story walk is a fun family activity which promotes literacy and physical activity as well as community involvement.



This project has been a collaboration with the Riverside County Regional Park and Open-Space District, Idyllwild Nature Center; Riverside County Library System, Idyllwild Branch; Friends of the Idyllwild Library; Friends of the San Jacinto Mountain County Parks; and the Idyllwild Rotary Club. Our next planned Idyllwild Nature Center story time and story walk is scheduled for Saturday, August 12, 2023, for Butterfly Days.
