

# Friends of the Idyllwild Library Annual Meeting



Before we look ahead to what the new year holds, let's do a quick review of some of the end of the year children's programs. To kick off the holiday season, children were treated to a special story time with local author **Helle Brisson**, who enthusiastically read her charming book *Rasmoose the Christmas Moose*. We appreciate Helle taking time from her busy schedule to read her book.



Children and parents were also treated to a perfect recitation by **Art Connor** of the much beloved and iconic poem *Twas' the Night Before Christmas*, which was written in 1823, marking its 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2023.



Also, in December, **Mrs.** Claus made an enjoyable appearance at the library and delighted everyone with a lively and humorous magic show. As a special treat, Mrs. Claus applied temporary holiday-themed glitter tattoos for those who wanted them. Children also decorated Christmas cookies.









We are also pleased to resume the *Tales to Tails* early literacy program in collaboration with **Animal Samaritans** of Thousand Palms and its volunteer representatives **Rakeara**, AKC therapy dog, CGC and her handler **Claire Spence**. This special program is designed to help children improve their reading skills as well as develop their emotional and social skills.

We look forward to discovering the science that goes into making slime in February. Our goal with this effort is to have fun and learn some science in the process.

Youth Book Club, also known as "Idyllwild's Best Book Club," continues to be well-attended and a lot of fun. For the month of December, we read and discussed A Long Walk to Water by Linda Sue Park. The book club members were able to consider how fortunate we are to have good potable water and what those who live in other countries, such as the Sudan where the book takes place, go through to search for clean and drinkable water. Greenglass House, a mystery by Kate Milford, was the reading selection for January. We will be reading about English orphans during World War II for February's choice, which is the book A Place to Hang the Moon by Kate Albus. Tate Donovan continues to do a fantastic job in helping to facilitate this popular program. To add to the fun, we

always enjoy a craft related to the selected book as well snacks connected to the story.

Mr. Wyatt's background includes his former position as Library Associate for 6 months in 2023 in Wildomar Public Library. With a B.S. degree from the University of Phoenix, and a major in business management, he comes fully equipped with past experiences at various Southern California locations, including managerial positions at Home Depot in Perris and Coca-Cola's plant in San Diego.

In a short interview, he outlined his commitment to Idyllwild's library patrons

Mr. Wyatt also indicated a personal goal of becoming more Spanish-language effective for a further outreach to both communities.







